### D. Additional requirements

**IROMA34** Universitas Mercatorum is a distance teaching university and offers all its programs of study online. However, it is still possible for students from partner Universities to obtain Erasmus grants from their home institution to stay in Rome during the Erasmus mobility for study at Universitas Mercatorum.

Incoming students as all Universitas Mercatorum students will attend to their Italian taught courses and carry out assignments online. Exams, however, will take place in a traditional manner. Thus, at the end of courses students are required to come to Rome for oral or written exams. To secure a rapid adaptation, incoming students will receive on arrival assistance and advice in practical and academic issues. Academic tutoring is continuously guaranteed along the program period.

#### P LISBOA43

Although being a distance education institution, Universidade Aberta considers mobility of students and staff one of its core objectives.

In recent years, UAb has hosted foreign students from other European universities who were able to carry out successfully study programmes using the university's e-learning model. Similarly, Universidade Aberta encourages home students to mobility activities abroad, in spite of their specific professional and familiar limitations that distinguish them from conventional universities' students.
