D. Additional requirements

EMADRI D160: <u>NOTE:</u> Students are able to visit Spain and participate in the Erasmus programme under the action mobility for studies at the Madrid Open University. MOU is a distance teaching university and offers all its programmes of study online, however, it is still possible for students from partner Universities to secure Erasmus grant from their home institution and visit Spain for student mobility in Spanish taught courses. Incoming students as all MOU students will attend to their courses and carry out all assignments <u>online</u>. However incoming students will be able to attend to student group tutorial meetings held at MOU during their stay well as face to face seminars.

IROMA34

Universitas Mercatorum is a distance teaching university and offers all its programmes of study online. However, it is still possible for students from partner Universities to obtain Erasmus grants from their home institution to stay in Rome during the exchange program at Universitas Mercatorum. Incoming students as all Universitas Mercatorum students will attend to their courses and carry out assignments online. Exams, however, will take place in a traditional manner. Thus, at the end of courses students are required to come to Rome for oral or written exams. To secure a rapid adaptation, incoming students will receive on arrival assistance and advice in practical and academic issues. Academic tutoring is continuously guaranteed along the visiting period.

- 2. Partner University will send its decision maximum within 3 weeks.
- 3. A transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institutions no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished.
- 4. In case that one partner decides to terminate the agreement, all partners need to notified by 1 June at the latest. The decision will take effect as of 1 June the year after. A termination by mutual consent is possible. All students and staff who have been already admitted to bilateral exchange projects will be allowed to finish their projects as foreseen. The agreement is open to persons without discrimination according to ethnic background, nationality, creed, sex. Neither the European Comission nor the National Agencies can held responsible in case of a conflict.
